Here is the latest Iver Neighbourhood update from PC Hayley Edwards.

Firstly, a very Happy New Year to you all. During the Christmas and New Year period, the Iver Parish was still being served by the Neighbourhood Team, providing cover over the festive period, come rain or snow....quite literally!

Youth Anti Social Behaviour

During the last few weeks with the substantial amounts of snow, we have had lots of incidents of snowball throwing in and around the area, some of which has been light hearted fun; others haven't been – e.g. throwing snowballs at peoples' cars or homes. Due to these incidents, we have seen a rise in the number of calls to us regarding anti social behaviour but this is down to the freakish amounts of snow falling, school's being closed, etc.

The NAG are currently working with the NHPT and the ASB Team from the Council to look at ways to tackle incidents of ASB in the Iver area and we're also encouraging people to report it direct to us - If you don't tell us what's happening, we won't know what's going on. Please let us know; we may be able to help.

Speeding

The NAG members and the Neighbourhood Team will be arranging speed awareness days during the coming weeks to target speeding motorists in problematic areas.

The Roads Policing Unit has again been out in the Iver area and have issued fixed penalty notices to the offending motorists for speeding.

Burglary

Unfortunately, the Iver Heath area has had several burglaries over the last week during the day whilst the occupants are at work. Electrical items, cash and jewellery were taken during these burglaries. We cannot stress enough the importance of ensuring that your valuables are kept out of sight of burglars by either locking them away or having net curtains up at windows to make it more difficult to be seen. If further crime prevention advice is needed, please contact the Neighbourhood Team and we'll be happy to pay you a visit.

We ask that you remain extra vigilant in light of this, look out for yourselves and your neighbours by reporting to the police ANY person, vehicle or circumstances that you feel are suspicious as soon as it happens so that we are able to act on it.

The Neighbourhood Team are focusing their patrols and efforts on this at this time.
