This discussion was a long one and took an hour of the time from the meeting. It was also acrimonious with residents claiming that some members of the committee knew about the heritage listing and were involved in drawing it up. This was denied by the members of the committee.

The chair noted that since the last meeting he had written to the lead person at Bucks who manages the list and has had no response in any form. He will continue to try and contact her.

The residents were encouraged to either; make a formal complaint to Bucks about the process of adding houses to a list where residents were not informed with no recourse to removing the houses, and /or writing directly to the leader of the Council Martin Tett or head of Planning Eric Owens and also making a freedom of information claim (form is on the Bucks Council web site) for each individual house.

They were also invited to send a representative to sit on this committee and make representations to the clerk at IPC to join in with the revision of the Neighbourhood plan.

The committee felt they were being targeted and accused of complicity in something that the majority had no idea of until the last committee meeting and would like to remind residents that they are all volunteers and that the majority have no expertise in this area. They continue to do the best they can within their expertise levels to help as much as they can.

The chair will continue to try and contact the lead person and feed back at the next meeting or the AGM.
